

POLL SHOWS VOTERS FEEL **OVERLOOKED** AND ARE CONCERNED ABOUT CALIFORNIA POLICIES



While the commitment to fighting climate change remains strong, a recent poll shows Californians share serious concerns about how state policies are affecting their daily lives and the economy.*

Key Findings

84%

say politicians have overlooked people like them.



7 in 10 Californians are worried about how California's climate goals will affect their daily lives.

This sentiment is shared by strong majorities across party lines, age groups, genders, ethnicities, and education levels.

Most Californians are **NOT** willing to take action

Will not pay higher utility bills	81%
Will not change home from gas to electric	79%
Will not take public transportation more	79%
Will not drive less	74%
Will not shop online less	71%
Will not turn down heating /cooling system	60%



71% were also worried about the effect of California's climate goals on the economy.

75% agree that we can **NOT** put the environment over the basic needs of American families.
